Mississauga Chapter Annual Picnic-2012

Women in Engineering Committee Event. Royal Botanical Gardens Tour

On June 28, 2012, the Women in Engineering Committee sponsored a lunch and tour of the Royal Botanical Gardens. There were 40 members and their guests in attendance.

Following a networking lunch at the Royal Botanical Garden Centre, tour guides brought the group to the Rock Gardens and then the Rose Gardens/Hendrie Park Gardens.

The Rock Garden was built in 1930-1931 on the site of an abandoned gravel pit, and the 2.43-hectare (6-acre) site was RBG's first major display garden. Before its transformation, the surrounding area was littered with billboards and old shacks. As part of a make-work beautification project during the Depression, tons of weathered limestone rock were brought in from nearby quarries to create the garden's structure and its charming, irregular network of staircases, linked ponds, bridges, and waterfalls. Many years later, the rocks look as though they've been in place forever.

Following the tour of the Rock Garden, the group returned to the Rose Gardens/Hendrie Park, where the roses were in full bloom. This garden illustrates the diversity of



both plants and garden design. Native plants are plentiful in a cultivated setting, and there is a large vegetable garden, medicinal garden and a dark water reflecting pond.

EIT Event on Job Market Prospects and Trends in Canada



The EIT Committee organized an EIT event on September 5, 2012 from 7:00 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. at the Trinity Hall, Canadian Coptic Centre, 1245 Eglinton Avenue West to get the chapter's registered EITs engaged and involved in planning future activities. The event included a presentation by chapter EIT Committee Chair Galal Abdelmessih, P.Eng., PMP, on the engineering job market prospective and trends in Canada (by discipline and province) for the period 2010 to 2018, based on the published report by Engineers Canada.

Event Summary

The event was a free event, attended by 31 EITs and three board members. The committee Chair facilitated a workshop to brainstorm ideas for future EIT events and to get the EITs involved. By the end of the workshop, eight EITs volunteered to sit on the committee.

Tour of the Mid-Halton Waste Water Treatment Plant

On September 19, 2012, the Environment Committee sponsored a tour of the Mid-Halton Wastewater Treatment plant for 30 chapter members.

The Mid-Halton wastewater treatment plant is one of seven treatment plants in Halton. Design work is underway for a future plant expansion. The plant runs 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Employees from Halton Region are available on site during the day, and after hours alarms can be investigated remotely through a SCADA system.

Sewage is carried from homes and businesses through the collection system to the treatment plant. Large inorganic solids are screened out and separated from the liquids and primary clarifiers help to settle the remaining solids. The

solids are removed from the clarifiers and heated, digested and removed as biosolids. The remaining liquid is sent to an aeration basin where the dissolved organic matter is consumed by microorganisms. The remaining solids will settle and be removed in the final clarifiers. Phosphorus is removed by adding chemicals. The treated water is tested in the plant's laboratory to ensure it meets all of the regulatory requirements. The final effluent is discharged into Lake Ontario.

The Environment Committee would like to thank all of the Halton employees who stayed late to conduct the tour. It was very informative for all of the attendees.

Copeland's interactive audience participation demonstration, the day's events were found to be both explicative and entertaining.

Thanks to the efforts of guest moderator Gary Williams P.Eng., the audience was able to ask pressing questions of the business moguls. Panellists included Dr. Joseph C. Paradi, P.Eng., professor emeritus, University of Toronto; Suneet Singh Tuli, founder of DataWind Limited; and Sandra Murre, P.Eng., CEO of Jordan Engineering Inc. Attendees were also encouraged to partake in up to three out of six concurrent seminars in the afternoon, with themes ranging from "How to Start Your Business", with Monica Goyal, to "Legal Aspects of Entrepreneurial Endeavours", with Hussein Hamdani. Glass Fibre Reinforcement: Changing the Concrete Construction

Industry

Three disguised speakers accepted the chapter's invitation to attend and put forward their presentations about GFRP reinforcement in concrete construction. Their presentations were very extensive and valuable and generated great participation from the attendees through many related questions and answers.

Planned One Day Conference in Late October 2012

The Education Committee organized the fifth Annual Mathletics Challenge, which was held at Tomken Road Middle School on November 10, 2012

Objective of the competition

The Mathletics Challenge has been conducted for the last five years by the Mississauga Chapter. It is a math competition aimed at middle school students and is in the format of a quiz, with questions revolving around math, physics and engineering. It aims to:

- promote engineering among middle school students;
- help students understand engineering as it applies to real life practical problems; and
- · create an interest in math and problem solving.

Summary

The planning and coordination process for this event began in September with weekly meetings to organize questions, transition to improved software and testing. Registration was online and through schools; it was open to all students under the Peel District School Board in Mississauga. The competition was conducted for two levels:

- Junior level for grade 6;
- Senior level for grades 7 and 8.

Over 90 students attended the program. The two levels were conducted in a morning and afternoon session, with opening comments by the Mississauga Chapter Chair, and the Principal and Vice-Principal of the school. Lunch was provided to all attendees.

Participation certificates were provided to all students. The winners received medals, certificates and gift cards in recognition of their achievement. We received positive feedback from the students, teachers and parents, with high interest in repeat participation.

The PEO Mississauga Chapter would like to thank the students, parents, volunteers, teachers and Tomken Road Middle School for their support to help make this event a resounding success.

Two of the community centres have also qualified for the CBIP (Canada Building Incentive Program) grant for energy efficient design. The Ontario Power Authority presented Mississauga an award in "Leadership in Sustainable Energy Management" in 2005. In 2008, the Mississauga Board of Trade presented the "Environmental Excellence Award" to the City of Mississauga.
