Mississauga Chapter delivered yet another busy year full of events. Here are some of them:



Past Events

Your chapter board supported by a team of volunteers continues to support both our community and the profession by arranging a variety of activities. The events that took place during the fall are described below.



Woman in Engineering and the Additive Manufacturing event

On October 29, 2013, the WIE Committee at Mississauga Chapter held a seminar on "Building Innovation One Layer at A Time, The Additive Manufacturing Advantage" at Carmen Corbasson Community Centre. About 17 members and one executive member attended. The presentation began with Katherine Diep introducing Eugene Levin, EIT, from Proto3000 Inc. Eugene talked about rapid technologies and additive manufacturing being at the forefront of manufacturing and product development growth in North America. With these technologies and processes being used to conceive, develop, test, improve and manufacture prototypes and new products, there is a clear advantage in bringing innovations to market faster and more cost effectively. As materials and machines become more affordable, portable and readily available to the public, adoption of the technology will be more widespread, leading to further developments in material selec-

tion and process efficiency. The transition from traditional to digital methods has already produced countless engineering and manufacturing applications.

Eugene also presented the four techniques currently used in manufacturing. They are fused deposition modeling (FMD), selective laser sintering (SLS), stereolithography (SLA), and direct metal laser sintering (DMLS). On each technique, Eugene talked about the advantage and disadvantage, as well as application and equipment requirements.

The presentation ended with questions and answers, and a demonstration of products.

The event ended with networking.

PEO Mississauga Chapter Presents the Transportation Town Hall

As one of the most successful events in the area's recent memory, the PEO Mississauga Chapter was proud to host the Transportation Town Hall at the Noel Ryan Auditorium on Monday, November 4, 2013. A hot-button topic in its own right, the series drew the attention of several notable panellists, including Chris Hill, President and CEO of Electric Mobility Canada; Greg Percy, President Incumbent at GO Transit; and Martin Powell, Commissioner of Transportation and Works for the City of Mississauga. Linda Weichel, VP of the group CivicAction, and Adam Giambrone, Executive Transit Advisor for the City of Milwaukee, rounded out the panel, the latter of whom came straight from the airport after an 18-hour

flight to attend. David Lapp, P.Eng., Manager, Professional Practice at Engineers Canada, was the MC for the event, and fielded a variety of questions to the panel, dealing with all aspects of transportation, from relieving congestion during rush hour traffic times to the possibility of futuristic, selfactuated, "automatous" vehicles. In addition, Mayor Hazel McCallion provided an impromptu keynote address to the audience, noting that she had just returned from a meeting at Queen's Park, with a commute time of almost two hours, a blunt yet truly disappointing reality when travelling within the GTA. As the mayor pointed out: "The GTA is the economic champ in Canada, and if we don't get our [transportation] infrastructure in good order we will not be a success". After several prepared questions were asked of the panel, the floor was opened up to the audience; a group of more than 230 registered engineers and professionals. Mr. Powell ultimately summarized the seminar most succinctly, quipping that the main goal was to "move people, instead of just vehicles". All in all, the event was well-attended and participants left the hall with a better understanding of the current

practices and practical issues involved in our transportation network. The Mississauga Chapter comprises over 6000 professional engineers in Mississauga and looks forward to similar support at its subsequent town halls and seminars.

- promote engineering among middle school students;
- help students understand engineering as it applies to real life practical problems; and
- create an interest in math and problem solving.

Summary

The competition was conducted for two levels:

Junior level for grade 6;

Senior level for grades 7 and 8.

Over 120 students attended the event. The two levels were divided into morning and afternoon sections, with opening comments made by the Mississauga Chapter Chair and the

principal of Tomken Road Middle School, this year's venue. Lunch was provided to all attendees.

Participation certificates were provided to all students. The winners received medals, certificates and gift cards in recognition of their achievement. We received positive feedback from the students, teachers and parents with high interest in repeat participation.

Workplace Relationships and the "Reptilian Brain"

Date: October 23, 2013 @ 6:30 p.m.-9:00 p.m. **Location:** Classroom 3, Mississauga Central Library **Speaker:** Bruce van Ryn-Bocking, MD, MBA

Mississauga Chapter hosted a two-hour speaking event on the Reptilian Brain at Work. Reptilian Brain, or the Brain Stem, is part of the human brain that is responsible for essential processes such as breathing, as well as survival, territorial behaviour and environment scan. This subject raised exceptional interest amongst engineers, as all 100 seats were registered in a matter of hours. We had great expectation for this event, and the speaker did deliver. Bruce van Ryn-Bocking, who is a Medical Doctor also holding an MBA degree from Laurier University, did an excellent job covering the subject. His

presentation was relevant, at times humorous and very engaging for the audience. About 70 engineers were in attendance, and they learned something new about the human brain and human behaviour. Bruce answered questions from the audience – and there were many. The feedback from attendees was overwhelming, which makes us consider inviting Bruce van Ryn-Bocking again. Engineers as Politicians

This year's iteration of the "Engineers As..." seminar series was no exception to the trend and continued to exemplify the high expectations of the chapter. Entitled "Engineers as Politicians", and organized by Khaled El-Rahi, the event took place on Saturday, October 26, 2013 at the Coptic Church on Eglinton Ave. This time, connections were made throughout all levels of government. MPs, MPPs, and city councillors were all challenged to describe the ways that engineering as a profession could augment the political landscape of Canada. Advice was largely unanimous in maintaining that the key factor was to stay informed, with two-thirds of attendees stating their intent to maintain the involvement in politics, or to become more involved in subsequent elections. MPs Brad Butt and Corneliu Chisu, P.Eng., lauded the chapter for its efforts, and with PEO representatives from West Toronto Chapter and head office on hand, promised to convey our profession's best interests to the leaders of our country. The success of the event, as monitored by a subsequent exit survey, was again largely positive, with 95 per cent of registrants once again showing their intent to return to the seminar series next year. A more pleasing statistic was our representation of young engineers at the session-a full one-third being below the age



of 25. A big thanks goes out to the Committee Chair and organizing committee for the event, namely Juwairia Obaid, EIT, Saira Obaid, Harsharan (Jeff) Hujan, P.Eng., Suhad (Sam) Ateia, EIT, and Jordan DeMello, EIT.

Region of Peel Hanlan Water Project

Date: Wednesday December 4, 2013

The Hanlan Water Project is the largest and most extensive watermain initiative the Region of Peel has ever designed and constructed. When it's completed, the Hanlan Water Project will:

- move 400 million litres of water each day through the Hanlan Feedermain; and
- move 120 million litres of water each day through the Mississauga City Centre Subtransmission Watermain. That's enough water to fill 408 Olympic swimming pools every single day!

The project includes installing the 8-foot-diameter Hanlan Feedermain and 5-foot-diameter Mississauga City Centre Subtransmission Watermain. Anthony Parente, P.Eng., described the technical challenges of the \$600-million project to 76 participants. A lively discussion followed the poster session and presentation.

Licensing Assistance Program (LAP) PEO Mississauga Chapter

Members of the public rely on Professional Engineers Ontario (PEO) to ensure that the licensed body of professional engineers in Ontario meets high standards of qualification, ethical practice and professional conduct. Formally arranging for an engineering intern – EIT (Canadian graduates and internationally trained engineers) to receive guidance and support from an experienced, licensed professional engineer will help this mandate. Licensing Assistance Program (LAP)-PEO Mississauga Chapter is a means to perpetuate the high standards and raise the profile of the profession. The following time-line provides the summary of our processes:

February/March: Announcement through the chapter's website to our members requesting interested engineering interns (EITs) and experienced professionals willing to help EITs in various disciplines to complete an on-line application (LAP Portal on PEO website).

April/May: Licensing Assistance Program (LAP) Committee compiles all requests and reviews requirements and completes the matching process.

May/June: Licensing Assistance Programme (LAP) contacts EITs (mentees) and corresponding experienced professionals (guides) and finalize the matching process

June/July: Licensing Assistance Program (LAP) Committee in collaboration with LAP Co-ordinator from PEO head office, organizes and conducts a training session for the EITs and guides.

July/December: EITs and their counterpart experienced professional engineer guides meet once/twice a month at a location convenient to both. LAP maintains a close contact and supports EITs and guides as needed.

December: Licensing Assistance Program (LAP) Committee in conjunction with LAP Co-ordinator PEO organizes an "Appreciation Event" to close out the present round of matching sessions.
